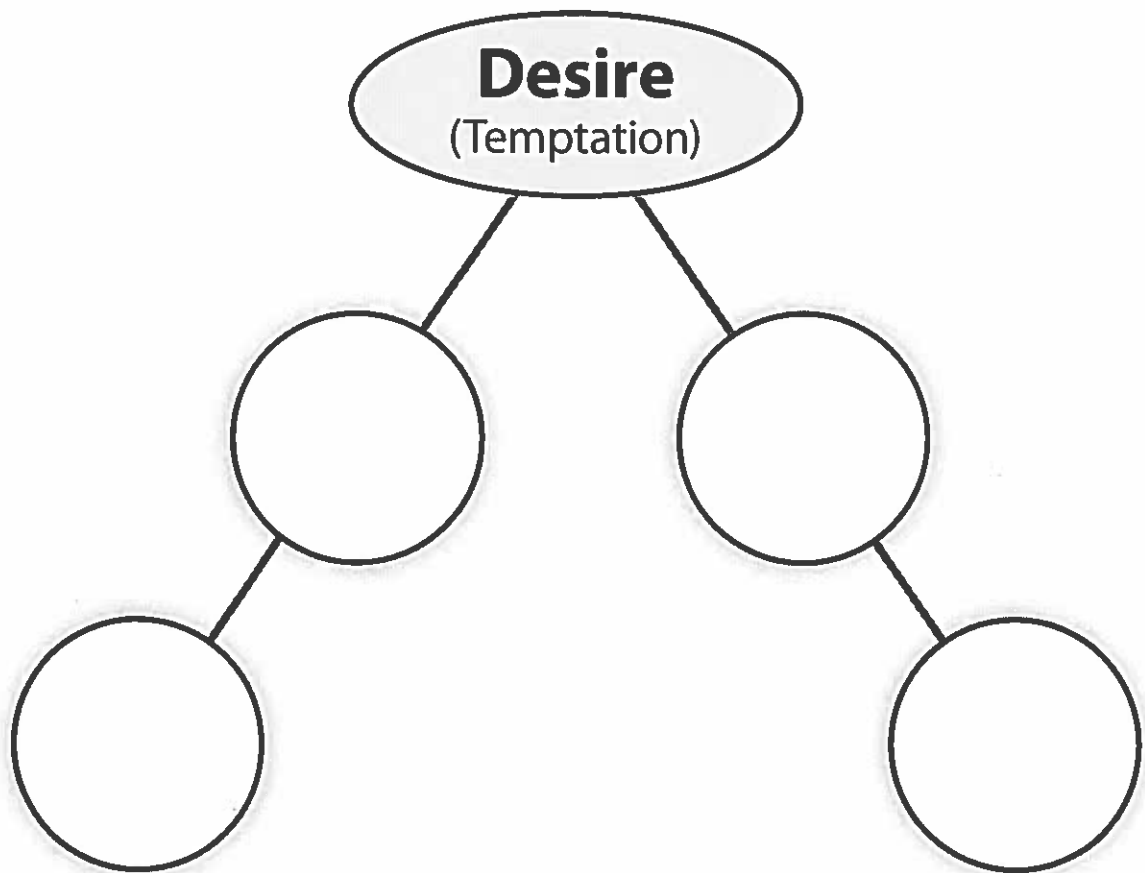




James 1:12–15
