Sacramental Information

BAPTISMS:

Sundays: 1:30pm, twice a month. The Church calls GODPARENTS, to be practicing Catholics, examples of Christ-centered living today. All Godparents should submit Sponsor letters from their Parish ASAP—but no later than <u>three</u> weeks before the scheduled Baptism. <u>PARENTS</u> must attend a Baptismal Preparation Session. (Registration is required.)

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements must be made at least one year in advance—<u>before</u> any social plans. Either the bride or groom must be a registered member of our parish. Once the marriage questionnaire is completed and returned, a Parish Priest or Deacon will then contact the couple.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

In case of serious illness or accident, phone the Pastoral Center. A communal celebration of the Sacrament is held each year in the Spring.

RECONCILIATION:

Individual Confessions Saturdays, 12:30pm in the Church.

HOMEBOUND PARISHIONERS: Parishioners desiring the Sacraments, please contact Pastoral Center.



ST. THOMAS THE APOSTLE

Priesthood, Consecrated Life, Sacramental Marriage and Single Life

<u>Vocation</u> — A vocation is God's invitation to love and serve him and his Church in a particular way of life. It is a call to live on earth in a way that will impact eternity. The word itself is derived from the Latin word *vocare* which means 'to be called.'

<u>Priest</u> — A man is ordained to the priesthood through the Sacrament of Holy Orders. Diocesan priests are called to serve the people of a particular diocese like Fr. Jay, Fr. John and Fr. Joseph serve the people of the Diocese of Metuchen. Men called to be priests in religious orders belong to communities like the Franciscans and the Benedictines.

<u>**Religious Life**</u> — Priests, brothers, monks, sisters, and nuns who separate themselves from the world to some degree according to their religious institute's mission and purpose to witness the coming of the Kingdom of God. This radical witness is made through the public profession of the vows of poverty, chastity and obedience and is a permanent commitment made in a specific religious institute recognized by the Church.

<u>Sacramental Marriage</u> — A covenant between baptized man and a woman and establishes a partnership of the whole life, which is ordered toward the good of the spouses and procreation and education of offspring.




Stewardship Scripture Reflection

September 29, 2024 - 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Today's Gospel reading seems violent! Losing a hand, eye, or foot is no laughing matter. We rarely stop to think about them, but we rely on these body parts during every moment of our waking hours. Jesus' intent in this teaching, however, is not that we should aim ourselves in an attempt to live a sin-free life. Instead, we're asked to consider an underlying question: What do I hold so tightly that it can become an obstacle to living the way that Christ is calling me to live? And - how is that?
